In Isaiah 6:8, Isaiah heard the Godhead communing together as to whom will be sent to Israel, who was far from God at this time. Isaiah heard the voice of the Lord and said, "Here am I, send me". Now there is no doubt that Isaiah was commissioned at this time to go to Israel to tell the people, "Hear ye indeed, but understand not; and see ye indeed, but perceive not. Make the heart of this people fat, and make their ears heavy, and shut their eyes; lest they see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart, and convert, and be healed." (Isaiah 6:9–10)

But there is far more here than meets the eye. There was another One who was "sent" (Matthew 10:40, Mark 9:37, Luke 4:18; 9:48; 10:16; John 4:34; 5:24; 5:30; 5:36–37; 6:38–44, etc.), and it was the Lord Jesus Christ who said, "For I have not spoken of myself; but the Father which sent me, he gave me a commandment, what I should say, and what I should speak." (John 12:49) He would say, "that I do nothing of myself; but as my Father hath taught me, I speak these things." (John 8:28)

Hi Paul, the word Immanuel comes from two Hebrew words, im meaning "with", and e which is "God", hence the meaning "God with us" (Matthew 1:23, Isaiah 7:14). It is the "virgin" who shall "conceive, and bear a son". This is the miracle of the Incarnation, God incarnate in human flesh, which is implied by the "seed of the woman" (Genesis 3:15), who would destroy the works of the Devil. Men produce genetic seed naturally, but a woman could only generate a "seed" supernaturally, via the virgin birth. God "prepared a body" (Hebrews 10:5) in the womb of the "virgin", and the "fullness of the Godhead" dwelt in Him bodily (Colossians 2:9).
